Please find below the response to your recent Freedom of Information request regarding acute adult psychiatric inpatient beds within NHS South Sefton CCG.

Request/Response:

Background Information

The Royal College of Psychiatrists has established a Commission to review the provision of inpatient psychiatric care for adults in England and Northern Ireland in response to concerns about whether there are sufficient acute inpatient psychiatric beds and alternatives to admission available for patients.

As part of this work, the Commission is exploring how many <u>acute adult psychiatric inpatient beds</u> are commissioned – and from whom – by CCGs both within the geographical catchment area of the mental health provider trust footprint that the CCG commissions services from and 'out-of-area' from that trust. As well as the numbers of beds, the Commission is also interested in how many patients in those different beds are classed as 'delayed transfers of care' (aka DTOCs).

Definitions

- Acute adult inpatient beds provide care with intensive medical and nursing support for
 patients in periods of acute psychiatric illness. Please note that this request concerns acute
 inpatient psychiatric beds for working age adults only.
- The NHS definition of a <u>delayed transfer of care</u> is as follows:
 A delayed transfer of care from mental healthcare occurs when a patient is ready to depart from such care and is still occupying a bed.
 A patient is ready for transfer when:
 - (1) A clinical decision has been made that patient is ready for transfer

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AND

- (2) A multi-disciplinary team decision has been made that patient is ready for transfer AND
- (3) The patient is safe to discharge/transfer.
- An Independent sector provider is a 'for profit' organisation.
- A third sector provider is a 'not for profit'/charitable organisation.
